#### Introduction

The *Daily Du'aa Series* teaches children in Preschool to 3<sup>rd</sup> Grade essential Islamic ad'iyaa (supplications) through rhyming stories that engage and entertain. The information taught in this series is based on the classic text *Hisnul-Muslim* (Fortification of the Muslim) by Sa'id Ibn 'Ali Ibn Wahf Al-Qahtaani and supporting references from the *Qur'aan* and Sahih ahadith. Therefore, you can rest assured that you are teaching from the most authentic sources.

- English transliteration (to assist with correct pronunciation)

Arabic Transliterations: The following rules of pronunciation have been used.

- 1. U is sounded as the short U in 'up' (Fut-ha, not Fat-ha)
- 2. E is sounded as the long E and in 'eat' (e-dhaa, not i-dhaa)
- 3. A is sounded like the A in 'spa' (Fut-ha)
- 4. If a letter is repeated twice, it means the sound should be elongated. For example, 'ma-laa-e-ka' where the 'laa' is longer than 'ma.'
- Dashes have been used to separate syllables in some (not all words) to make the pronunciation more accurate. So, in the example above, 'ma-laae-ka' has four syllables.
- We have made exceptions for certain words that are more commonly spelled in a way that does not follow these rules. For example, wudoo' instead of woodoo.'

**Conclusion:** We ask Allah to bless this series and the families that use it and to make it of benefit to the Muslim Ummah. May Allah accept these daily ad'iyaa from us and bless our hearts and homes through them-Ameen.

We hear the Adhaan called daily, So, we stop all our work and play,<sup>2</sup>


Because we know it's the best time, To remember Allah and pray!

Every time he asked his brother, Talha would smile and say, "Not yet..."


Then one day, Ahmad asked frankly, "How much bigger must I get?"

Come to prayer...


Come to success...

They don't need to make Adhaan, Whether praying in groups or alone,<sup>6</sup>


And like a jewel in a case, Its more beautiful to pray in their home.
